Rebecca Kaplan has represented the city of Oakland as the Councilmember At-Large since 2009. Before joining the Oakland City Council, she was the At-Large Director on the AC Transit Board of Directors from 2002 to 2008. While at AC Transit, she helped introduce hydrogen fuel cell buses. Rebecca also worked to bring solar power to AC Transit and Oakland. As a current Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC) member, Rebecca has played a crucial role in several significant sustainable transportation improvements throughout the region. She introduced battery electric vehicles and charging stations to Oakland and neighboring areas. Rebecca also worked with various stakeholders to secure a State grant to help launch a program for zero-emission hydrogen fuel cell trucks and a hydrogen fueling station at the Port of Oakland.

Furthermore, in 2023, Rebecca authored and successfully passed a council resolution requesting Oakland be selected as a clean Hydrogen energy hub. As a result, Oakland was one of the chosen locations when President Biden's administration announced up to \$1.2 billion to California's hydrogen hub, bringing green jobs and improved air quality. Rebecca Kaplan is an honors graduate of MIT and Stanford Law School.
